Our Nursery and Early Years Provision is driven by these three aims:

Aim 1: To provide outstanding Educational Services for our children and our families.

- Our curriculum and provision are reviewed and re-designed in response to our sensitive analysis of our children's and community's needs.
- The curriculum is designed to celebrate our family's achievements and ensure all feel secure, safe; welcome and supported. We have a responsibility to design an Early Years curriculum that meets the needs of the particular children and families we are working with and shows unconditional, professional, love towards them.
- High quality provision and support in the earliest stages of a family's connection to school will continue to have positive and enduring effects on health and life chance outcomes for both our children and are families.

Aim 2: To positively impact on the social, environmental and economic inequality damaging the health and wellbeing of our most vulnerable families

- To increase children and young people's access to NHS-funded community mental health services
- The co-production of community-based health and care which promotes equality for all;
- To sufficiently reach the target groups of children and parents.
- To identify gaps in current provision and design projects to address these gaps
- To work with communities that face health inequalities

Aim 3: To build evidence of sustainable, scalable solutions to mitigate and prevent inequalities impacting on the health and wellbeing of communities

- To research evidence proven ways in which multi service approaches can positively impact on children's development.
- To co construct and create a multi service approach; looking at other models across London and the UK to continually inform our planning, provision and success in commissioning more services.
- To review the NIPA programme through an official NIPA Scrutiny and Review committee.

- ✓ Working parent entitlement for children aged 3 to 4 years

- ✓ The entitlement is available Monday to Friday
- ✓ You can access between the hours of 8.30 - 11.30 or 12.30 - 3.30 entitlement hours at no charge
